Inclusion Matters! ❖ Mrs. Rochman will make and hang posters about inclusive schools. ❖ K - 5 students will complete Many Hands: One Community activity. Teachers will then display Many Hands: One Community outside the classroom. ❖ K grade - Invite students to write a list of all of their unique characteristics under a picture of themselves. Display student work during the week. ❖ 1st grade – Students will complete a graphic organizer on Miraculous Me. ❖ 2nd grade – Students will complete a graphic organizer on Unwrapping My Gifts. ❖ 3rd grade - Ask students to create Inclusion School Week cards including reasons why they like being part of an inclusion school. ❖ 4th grade – Assign students to write an essay describing how to be a good friend. Have each student share their thoughts on kindness, acceptance, and friendship. ❖ 5th grade – Ask students to write about a time they didn't feel included in a group. Talk about how it made them feel. Ask them how their experiences relate to anyone who is perceived as different and what challenges they might face in a school setting.

Each class will create a poster to highlight ways to respect our differences. ❖ Students (3-5) will complete a Learning Style Assessment and have a classroom discussion about the various ways that people learn and why it is important to know how each individual learns the best.
